HRI Dogs: Miracles Do Happen



This two-year-old was turned in with ectopic ureters, a birth defect. She urinated down her leg without any control and either wore a diaper or needed to be outside. She required frequent bathing to keep her skin from being severely burned. Her second owner, a vet tech, knew the issues and could not afford surgery. Because of this, she wanted her placed with HRI. The best surgeon and a foster with long experience caring for surgical recoveries were found. MRIs showed not one but two ectopic ureters. The success rate for this surgery is 25%. Very scary but HRI knew this girl needed a chance! The surgery was performed the end of May. HRI prayers, were offered and every finger crossed! Her surgery went well and she finally seems to be urinating normally. Time will tell about housebreaking. It is much more challenging for her as it is so unfamiliar. She is a sweet and happy dog who loves treats and wants to please. She will be a wonderful addition to her new home.

What Does CGC Mean?



CGC stands for **Canine Good Citizen**.

It is a proud thing to have. It is added to your dog's name at the end just like Agility, Obedience, and Rally titles. All you need is a certified instructor and to pass the 10 tests below. An owner also signs a responsible owner pledge.

The AKC website gives you instructions on how to train these skills and the explanation of what is expected.

Test 1: Accepting a friendly stranger

Test 2: Sitting politely for petting

Test 3: Appearance and grooming

Test 4: Out for a walk (walking on a loose lead)

Test 5: Walking through a crowd

Test 6: Sit and down on command and staying in place

Test 7: Coming when called

Test 8: Reaction to another dog

Test 9: Reaction to distraction

Test 10: Supervised separation
